The CME on the HPLC Method and its Applications was organized by the Pathology Department at the Lecture Hall in the new OPD building on June 15th, 2022.



The submission of ADRs through ICSRs reported to the AMC is done on a regular basis to provide reports with as much accuracy as possible.




